

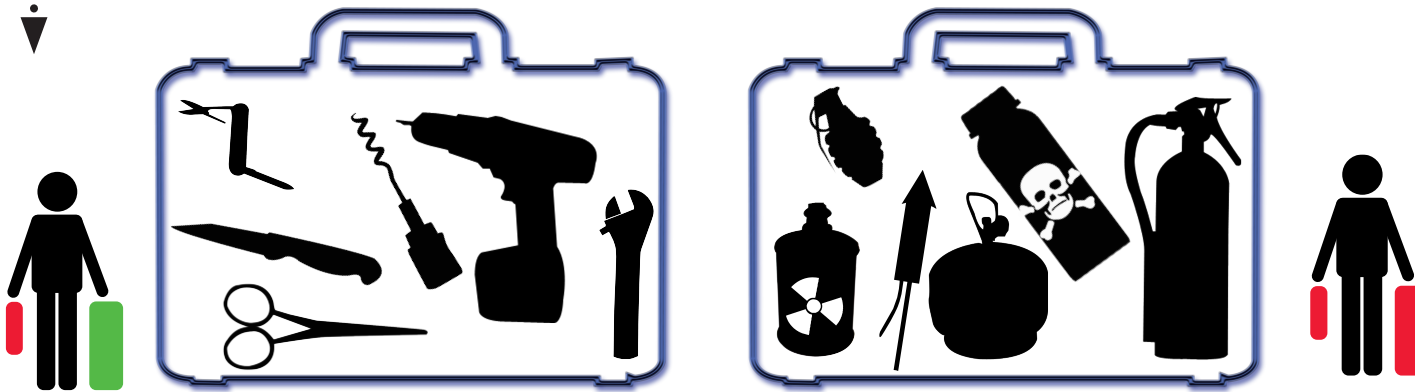
- All liquids bought in shops at airports outside the European Union (EU) or at the EU airports in front of the point where you show boarding card for the first time are subject to restrictions therefore it is recommended to put them into the hold (check-in) baggage. Liquids that have been bought at the EU airports beyond the point where you show your boarding for the first time are allowed for transport on board of an aircraft, provided they are sold and packed in a special sealed and transparent bag with satisfactory proof of purchase on the day of journey. For your convenience we advise not to open this bag until screening at your last transfer airport is performed. If you have direct flight, please do not open this bag until plane takes off.

- In case you have bought liquids in containers greater than 100 ml at non-EU airport or on board of an aircraft originating from non-EU airport and transfer in Poland, please, put these liquids at the airport in Poland into your cabin (hand) baggage and hand it over at check-in desk for carriage in the aircraft's hold. Always when you transfer, we advise you to ask a seller at airport shop beyond the first boarding control point or on board, to pack all liquids bought in a special sealed and transparent bag with satisfactory proof of purchase on the day of journey. If you have direct flight (without transfer) you may take on board all liquids bought beyond the screening point without any restrictions.

How to facilitate security controls at airports?

Make sure you do not have prohibited items in your baggage



- Some items are prohibited for carriage on board and in cabin baggage. In order to facilitate and accelerate screening procedures we kindly ask you to put these items into your hold baggage. The picture above shows examples of items prohibited on board of an aircraft e.g. guns (also their replicas, imitations, toy guns), knives, scissors, bats, clubs, flammable and explosive substances, gas containers in large volumes, fishing rods, string instruments. For your convenience or in case of any doubts, please, ask at check-in desk whether the items you wish to carry in your cabin baggage are allowed on board of an aircraft.

- Additionally we kindly inform that certain items (examples in picture above) are not allowed for transportation on board of an aircraft as well as in hold baggage. Therefore any explosives, ammunition, flammable liquids, fireworks, gasoline, gas bottles, radioactive, corrosive or toxic substances, tear gas, mace and similar chemical gases and substances, are strictly prohibited in hand and/or check-in baggage. In case you intend to transport gun or other firearm, report this to ground personnel at check-in desk.

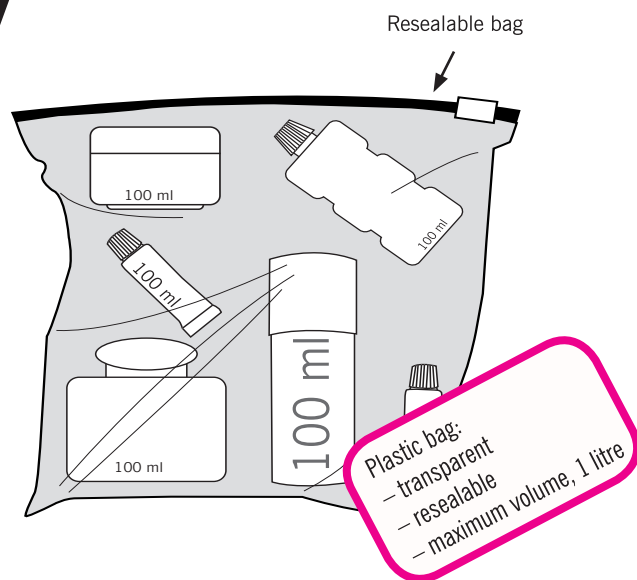


- For your convenience we kindly advise to pack all items, including liquids, that are not essential for you during flight into hold baggage you hand over at check-in desk. In order to facilitate and accelerate screening procedures we kindly ask you to pull out of cabin (hand) baggage a transparent bag with allowed liquids and put it into the tray at the

screening point with other items carried (e.g. mobiles, wallets, watches). Additionally, we kindly ask you to take off your jacket and/or coat as well as to remove laptops and other electrical items from your cabin baggage. They will be screened separately whilst you are screened.

Reduce waiting time at screening points

Learn about rules of carrying liquids on board of an aircraft



- All liquids, creams, gels, pastes, mascaras, aerosols (hairspray, hair foam) are allowed for transport on board of an aircraft in containers with the capacity not greater than 100 ml and contained in one bag of a capacity not exceeding 1 litre. The bag must be transparent and resealable (e.g. pressure of zip seal). If you do not have such a bag, please ask for it at check-in desk.

- Baby food, essential medications as well as special nutrition are permitted on board. In order to facilitate screening, please, be ready to show the proof that they are required for medical purposes or dietary requirements. In order to facilitate screening we advise you to pull such items out of your cabin baggage at screening point and show them to a screener. So as to avoid difficulties, please, be ready to show the proof that they are required for medical purposes or dietary requirements (e.g. prescription). For security reasons you may be asked to provide the proof of authenticity of such a liquid.
